Compare it to the 2003 Cabernet Sauvignon - awake after its winter slumber and nearly ready for blending.

June 19th is your chance to try your hand at the art of blending wine. Enjoy this rare opportunity to see all the components of all the wines, in barrel, before they are blended, as well as the opportunity to impress your friends and family with your extensive knowledge of wine.
