SEPTEMBER 2001 New Wine Releases

This September we are releasing four new wines, including the 2000 Columbia Valley Semillon, 2000 Seven Hills Vineyard Estate Semillon, 2000 Columbia Valley Chardonnay and 1999 Walla Walla Valley Merlot. Descriptions of these wines are profiled below. Seeing that "2000" vintage on the wine bottle seems odd, yet here they are, time keeps moving on.

2000 Columbia Valley "Barrel Fermented" Semillon - \$14

This wine is a blend of 85% Semillon and 15% Sauvignon Blanc, and includes such great vineyards as Klipsun, Yakima Bend Ranch, and Charbonneau. Bright and crisp, this toasty floral wine shows nutty fig flavors with a honey lemon zest. Our cool nights during final fruit maturity provides a backbone of crisp natural acidity to this wine.

2000 Seven Hills Vineyard Estate Semillon - \$21

This 100% Estate Semillon is the only Bordeaux white wine varietal planted at our Seven Hills vineyard. Rich and robust, this Semillon shows ripe peach, melon and mango fruit, with a viscous vanilla custard, crème brulee and spicy nutmeg finish.

2000 Columbia Valley Chardonnay - \$19

The principal vineyard in this vintage is from Fair Acre, providing delicate sweet tropical fruit aromas, with subtle mineral, dried mango and dates. Very Burgundian in style, its spicy sweet ginger and candy apple flavors balance well with the crisp natural acidity.

1999 Walla Walla Valley Merlot - \$35

95% Merlot and 5% Cabernet Franc, this wine is a blend of three distinguished vineyards, Seven Hills, Pepper Bridge, and Forgotten Hills, all in the Walla Walla Valley. Big dark and chewy, this Merlot shows black cherry, spicy plum and cassis, with flavors of toffee and chocolate on the long finish.

From the Winemaker

The Harvest — The 2004 harvest is looking promising. In early August, we started veraison in most vineyards: this is the time when the grape clusters begin to soften and develop red color in the skins. We are slightly alread of 1997 in terms of heat units, but it has not been as warm as 1994 or 1998. We have been aggressive in terms of crop thinning, dropping our total yields below 4 tons per acre. We shoot thinned in May in order to open the canopy, create better cluster spacing, and broaden sun exposure. In most sites, we did a second pass of "green" thinning, to remove late coloring or poorly set clusters. My best guess is that we will begin harvest at Klipsun and mache Seven Hills early in September.

<u>Valley News</u>—Last May, the wineries and vineyards in Walla Walla banded togs ther to form the Walla Walla Valley Wine Alliance. There are now about 40 wineries in the valley and at least that many vineyards, with over 3,200 acres planted. The goal of the Alliance is to promote quality, excellence, and awareness for the Walla Walla Valley wine region. This group will provide organized and unified marketing that will develop programs and activities to further enhance the Walla Walla Valley's reputation. Lam currently on the Board of Directors, along with seven other industry members, and am honored to serve as the Wine Alliance's first President.

School News—After two and a half-great years as part of our winemaking team, forn Glase is leaving Elicole to start a new winery in downtown Walla Walla. We have enjoyed 'forn's tenure here and wish him the best of luck in his new venture. While I may set the direction in our winemaking practices and emeyard relationships, Mike Sharon oversees day to day winemaking operations. Mike has been part of the team since 1996 and stepped into the role of production winemaker in 1998. Joining our winemaking team on a full-time basis is Matt I-lis, a hard working, energetic person who we would like to clone. We also are pleased to have the full-time support of Margie Corn to our tasting room and office staft.

We have received numerous awards and glowing reviews during the past six months from several wine publications, such as Wine Enthusiast Magazine and Wine Spectator, and from several major competitions. A few of these awards are summarized below. We are especially proud of our 1999 Seven Hills Estate Semillon, which scored 93 points in Wine Enthusiast and picked up Gold medals at both the Northwest Wine Summit and the Northwest Enological Society. All eight of the wines we entered at this years' Northwest Wine Summit at Timberline Lodge, received Gold or Silver medals. At the Central Washington State Fair Wine Competition, we won Best of Class and Double Gold for our 1999 Seven Hills Vineyard Merlot, and Best of Class and Gold for our 1999 Columbia Valley Semillon.
